Welcome back to the Code Corner! I hope that 2007 is treating you all well. Earlier this year, the State of Pennsylvania adopted the 2005 National Electrical Code. With that in mind, let's look at a few new rules...

In Section 200.6, we are given the requirements for identifying grounded conductors (usually neutrals). While not a new rule, it is worth noting that conductors that are smaller than 4 AWG must be marked white, gray, or with three white stripes along their entire length. It is not permissible to use a black (or other color) insulated conductor and then re-identify it at its termination. The enforcement of this rule may vary, but it is in the NEC in Section 200.6(A). For conductors 4 AWG and larger, identification with tape or other method at the termination is permitted (Section 200.6(B)).

Section 200.6(D) contains the requirements for grounded conductor identification when there are multiple voltage systems within a structure. Where multiple voltage systems exist and the wiring from different voltage systems is installed in the same enclosure, we must identify the grounded conductor by system. The precise method of identification permitted closely follows the rules set forth in 200.6(A) & (B) (see the 2005 NEC for the complete text). The last sentence in Section 200.6(D) requires us to post the means of identification at each branch-circuit panelboard.

The NEC also contains rules for the marking of ungrounded ("hot") conductors where multiple voltage systems are installed in a structure. For branch circuits, we refer to Section 210.5(C). It states that all of the ungrounded conductors shall be identified by system wherever the conductors are accessible. This requires us to identify these conductors at every pull box, junction box, enclosure, etc. For a project that utilizes prefabricated cabling systems (such as type MC cable), this rule almost mandates that we order the cable with the proper colors from the suppli-

er. It would be quite tedious to go through an installation and identify those conductors manually at every 1900 box, j-box, LB, etc. The rule for the identification method to be posted at each branch-circuit panelboard parallels the rule in Section 200.6.

Feeder conductors have very similar rules for identification where more than one voltage system exists in a structure. These requirements are set forth in Section 215.12(C). As with branch circuit conductors, the identification must occur at every point of accessibility for the conductor, and the method of identification must be posted at the feeder panelboards.

The rules for identifying equipment grounding conductors are located in Section 250.119. Here, as with grounded conductors, we are prohibited from identifying black (or other) conductors smaller than 4 AWG with green tape at the terminations. This does not apply to bare grounding conductors. They do not need to be identified.

In conclusion, the above listed rules combine into a requirement for us to identify the color code or other conductor identification system at every panelboard in structures that have multiple voltage systems installed within them. It is interesting to note that grounding conductors do not need to be separately identified by system. We may use green conductors throughout the installation for any voltage system. Be sure to follow these rules and be prepared to open troughs, wireways, junction boxes, etc., for your inspector during the final inspection phase of your multiple-voltage-system projects.

The above is not a formal interpretation of the National Electrical Code.
